Strategy 1—Early Learning

Implementation of Transitional Kindergarten

One of our priority actions for 2019-20 was to evaluate options for summer or school year programming for students who enter kindergarten with no formal early learning experience.

O The data that informed this priority action was a combination of the WaKIDS data for our kindergarten students with no formal early learning experience and growth data from our Jump Start Program.

O The outcome of this priority action is the implementation of a Transitional Kindergarten program starting with three sections opening in January of 2021.

Board Adoption of Our Racial Equity Policy

One of our priority actions for 2019-20 was to work with students, staff, families and the community to develop and adopt our Racial Equity Policy.

Last May, following an extensive process that included a broad variety of stakeholders, the Board took final action to approved the Racial Equity Policy.

O The Racial Equity Policy is being put into action during the 2020-21 school year with the development and implementation of an Equity Action Plan and work at each school led by site based Equity Leads supported by our Equity Facilitators.

Increasing Equitable Access to Accelerated Learning Opportunities

Dual Credit (AP, CHS, RS)

Ouring 2019-20 23% of Hispanic/Latinx students at MVHS are enrolled in Dual Credit courses (AP, CHS, RS) compared to 22% during 2018-19, which is an increase of 4.5% almost meeting the goal of a 5% increase.

Highly Capable Program

Ouring 2019-20 2.6% of Hispanic/Latinx elementary and middle school students were identified for the Highly Capable Program compared to 2.1% during 2018-19, which is an increase of 19.2% meeting the goal of a 5% increase.

Graduation Rate Data

The 4 year graduation rate for all students at MVHS (Emerson) went from 80.4% for the class of 2019 to 78.3% for the class of 2020 which is a decrease of 2.6% not meeting the goal of a 3% increase.

The 5 year graduation rate for all students at MVHS (Emerson) went from 79.8%% for the class of 2018 to 83.3% for the class of 2019 which is a increase of 4.4% exceeding the goal of a 3% increase.

O The 4 year graduation rate for Hispanic/Latinx students at MVHS (Emerson) went from 77.5% for the class of 2019 to 71.8% for the class of 2020 which is a decrease of 7.4% not meeting the goal of a 5% increase.

O The 5 year graduation rate for Hispanic/Latinx students at MVHS (Emerson) went from 73.6% for the class of 2018 to 82.0% for the class of 2019 which is a increase of 11.4% exceeding the goal of a 5% increase.
