District Facts at a Glance

- 6,700 students
- 6 elementary schools, 2 middle schools, 1 high school, 1 homeschool partnership, and several cooperative programs in partnership with other districts and Skagit Valley College (e.g., NCTA, Open Doors, and SPARC)
- 56% Latino; 38% white; 3% Asian and Pacific Islander
- 64% free/reduced lunch
- 24% transitional bilingual; 17 home languages
- Approximately 1,000 employees
- \$110.2 million operating budget

Mount Vernon Community Context: The Opportunity Gap

- Median Household Income = \$14,000 below the state average and \$7,000 below Skagit County
- Children below federal poverty line = 1.4 times state average and 1.2 times the Skagit County average
- BA degree or higher ≈ 63% of state average

Our Goal


100% of our students will graduate with the knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in postsecondary education, careers, and life.



Strengths


- Caring families who are supportive of their children's education

- Community support for a \$106.4 million construction bond

Challenges

- As of the Class of 2018, the on time graduation gap between LatinX (69.4%) and White (87.4%) was 18%
- Systemic barriers to equitable learning opportunities for all students
- Aligned practices across schools
- Lack of a coherent, tiered system of supports, particularly in grades 6 – 12
- Managing the impact of the Legislature's response to McCleary
