Elementary and Middle Level Migrant Program

- Significant hands on engagement with a focus on innovative problem solving
- Professional Development for teachers in Engineering is Elementary / Engineering is Everywhere
- Daily use of technology to support effective instruction
- 97% of students showed growth
- Consistent messaging around regular attendance and weekly celebrations of attendance

Online Credit Retrieval Program & PASS Program

- The credit retrieval options for high schools students were supportive and flexible
- The 34 students who regularly attended the online credit retrieval program earned 43 credits
- The 26 students in the PASS Program earned 16.3 credits

GEAR UP Coding Program in Partnership with Roberto Carcelen Foundation

- The program focused on a coding curriculum
- One week of instruction from Pacific Science Center staff
- Partnered with Voices for the Children to achieve STEAM program
- Field trips to the Pacific Science Center, Western Washington University & Bowman's Bay

Jumpstart

- Monday through Thursday July 30th to August 9th
- Designed to provide incoming kindergarten students who have not had a preschool experience with an introduction to classroom routines and rituals
- Learning is focused on Social Emotional needs specifically students ability to regulate their own emotions and behaviors and skills in establishing and sustaining positive relationships
- All students showed growth or maintained existing characteristics in WaKIDS Objectives 1 a-c and 2 c
 - Manages feelings
 - Follows limits and expectations
 - Takes care of own needs appropriately
 - Interacts with peers

AVID Excel Summer Bridge

- Serves long term English Learners who need specific supports in academic vocabulary and student skills
- The summer program had a focus on Building Community
- Two classrooms—one at La Venture and one at Mount Baker

Kulshan Center

- Open for students Monday through Thursday 1:30 to 4:30
- Reading support and access to books
- Positive Action Curriculum and STEM Kits
- Partnered with Mount Vernon Parks & Recreation for Mobile Playground
- Field Trips to Baker View Park (Trail Clean Up) and Rosario Beach

Bookmobile

- July 19th to August 31st Tuesday and Thursday 11:00 to 2:30
- Two Routes—Distributed over 5,000 books and many popsicles
- Added Parks—Bakerview, Hillcrest & Kiwanis Spray Park
- Included the FAE Summer Program housed at Skagit Valley College
