Support Services

- **Food Service**
 - Served breakfast daily during Migrant Summer School and Foundation for Academic Endeavors partner program (20 days)
 - Supported program at NCTA that allowed students in the Culinary Arts program to prepare and serve their peers each day
 - Breakfast Total = 6,308 & Lunch Total = 9,397
- **Transportation**—Bussed students daily for district and partnership programs for a total of 2,064 miles and 3300 rides
- **Custodial**—Classrooms and common areas maintained
- **Technology**—1 cart per classroom both iPads and Chromebooks
- **SeaMar**—Partnered to provide dental screenings at Migrant Summer School

Elementary and Middle Level Migrant Program

- Monday through Thursday July 8th to August 8th 8:30 AM to 1:00 PM
- Classroom Staff—MBMS 7 Certificated Teachers, 5 Instructional Assistants
- Support Staff—1 Administrator, 1 Head Secretary, 1 Family Liaison, and 1 Security
- Professional Development for teachers in Migrant 101 & Engineering is Elementary / Engineering is Everywhere
- Significant hands on engagement with a focus on innovative problem solving
- Consistent messaging on regular attendance, frequent communication with families, and celebrations of attendance
- 83% of students showed growth

Online Credit Retrieval Program & PASS Program

- Monday through Thursday July 8th to August 8th 8:30 AM to 1:00 PM
- Classroom Staff—MVHS 1 Certificated Teacher, 2 Migrant Liaisons
- The credit retrieval options for high schools students were supportive and flexible
- The 19 students who regularly attended the online credit retrieval program earned 9 credits
- The 33 students in the PASS Program earned 15 credits

GEAR UP Summer Programs

- UW Early Engineering Institute
 - June 26th to June 29th
 - 10 MVSD students along with 50 additional students from 13 different UW GEAR UP Partnership districts
 - Students worked with UW GEAR UP and College of Engineering staff engaging in Math Problem Solving and Hands On Engineering
- TOLTEC (Teaching Our Leaders to be Empowered by their Cultura) at SVC
 - August 5th to 22nd
 - 40 GEAR UP students from both MVSD (24) and BESD (16)
 - Students worked with SVC student mentors focusing on culturally relevant instruction and career exploration
 - Students engaged in leadership activities and went of field trips to Bellingham Technical College and University of Washington Bothell

Jumpstart

- Monday through Thursday July 30th to August 9th
- Designed to provide incoming kindergarten students who have not had a preschool experience with an introduction to classroom routines and rituals
- Learning is focused on Social Emotional needs specifically students ability to regulate their own emotions and behaviors and skills in establishing and sustaining positive relationships
- All 50 students served showed growth or maintained existing characteristics in WaKIDS Objectives 1 a-c and 2 c
 - Manages feelings
 - Follows limits and expectations
 - Takes care of own needs appropriately
 - Interacts with peers

AVID Excel Summer Bridge

- Served long term English Learners who need specific supports in academic vocabulary and student skills
- The summer program had a focus on Building Community
- Two teachers served a classroom of students at Mount Baker Middle School

Kulshan Center

- Open for students July 9th to August 15th Monday through Thursday from 1:30 to 4:30
- Reading support and access to books
- Positive Action Curriculum and STEM Kits
- Partnered with Mount Vernon City Library to provide arts & crafts activities
- Partnered with Seattle Science Center for Science on Wheels one week program
- Field Trip to Baker View Park (Trail Clean Up)

Bookmobile

- July 2nd to August 15th Tuesday and Thursday 10:30 am to 5:00 pm
- Two Routes—Distributed over 6,000 books and many popsicles
- New Stops—YMCA, Boys & Girls Club, and Migrant Summer School at MBMS
- New Partnerships
 - Mount Vernon City Library provided arts & crafts and library cards
 - Mount Vernon Parks and Recreation set up their Mobile Playground during Bookmobile stops at Kiwanis, Hillcrest, and Bakerview Parks
- Included the FAE Summer Program housed at Skagit Valley College

ESY

- 12 Day Program at MBMS
- Served 14 students in special education identified as demonstrating regression and extended recoupment time
- Classroom Staff
 - 2 Certificated Teachers, 7 Instructional Assistants
